58/25 Apologies were received from Cllr. Natalie Fletcher (reasons accepted and noted) and Westmorland and Furness (W&F) Cllr. Janet Battye

Cllr. Bland (Vice-Chair) chaired the meeting until the new Chair was elected

59/25 Election of Chair

Cllr. Bland proposed and Cllr. Grindey seconded Cllr. Clarke to be the Chair for 2025/26. There were no other nominations and the proposal was carried unanimously

- Crow Wood: No reply had yet been received regarding clarification of the ownership of the area used for parking
- Yellow line parking restrictions: The Council continued to pursue the requested extension to Plumtree which was under review.
- Field of Dreams: A reply to the Council's claim was still awaited
- Village 20 mph application update: The initial consultation from 4 June to 18 July 2025 was ongoing
- Community resilience (emergency planning) policy: The Annual Parish Meeting had agreed that a policy sounded sensible and the Clerk was asked to look for an example of a policy

66/25 Reports

- a. Westmorland & Furness Cllr. Battye had sent a written report regarding the 20 mph scheme, waste recycling, a parking review, the Local Plan, local funding and the removal of road signs by W&F Council
- b. The Athenaeum: Cllr. Grindey reported that the committee were looking at the installation of solar panels and the Council agreed that would be supported. He also said that the ladies' facilities needed improvement and that the committee were considering fund raising for that purpose

The development of 3 market dwellings comprising of conversion of one traditional stone barn, reinstatement of two traditional stone barns and conversion of two outhouses into ancillary garaging and storage for Woodhouse Farm

The Clerk was asked to clarify whether there had been any progress on the possibility of opening the old railway line to the community as part of the trailway

2025/0620/HOU The Stable, Haverflatts Lane, Milnthorpe

Installation of a metal framed glass greenhouse

2025/0023/FPA Blue Ridge, Woodhouse Lane, Heversham

Replacement double glazed uPVC timber effect window in north east and north west elevations. New glazed uPVC wood effect door and double glazed uPVC timber effect window to replace garage door. Replacement insulated up and over garage door

iii) Neighbourhood Plan group: It was reported that 3 sites had emerged in the Call for Sites

a) The pothole at the bottom of Woodhouse Lane and others in the village had been reported on HIAMS by Cllr. Clarke. It was agreed that Cllr. Battye should be asked to pursue a lasting repair of the one at the bottom of Woodhouse

Lane as opposed to the regular patching
