166/22 Apologies

Apologies were received from Clirs. Elizabeth Moffat and Adele Shepherd (reasons accepted and noted) and County Cllr. Roger Bingham

167/22 Minutes

Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 10 November 2022 be confirmed as a true record and be signed by the Chair

171/22 Ongoing Items

- B4RN: Cllr. Richards stated that there was nothing new to report. The Council expressed its gratitude to everyone who had helped for their efforts on behalf of the parish. It was agreed to no longer have B4RN as a standing item and to only pick it up as necessary
- Climate Change Working Group: Cllr. Richards reminded the Council that the Group had highlighted climate change considerations with regard to the decisions on both the street lights and speed limits
- Queen's Platinum Jubilee Tree Scheme: The 30 trees had been planted and students at Dallam School were to produce a plaque for the copse. It was agreed that the Council should apply for more free trees, which the Woodland Trust had said were available, using Cllr. Richards' field as a nursery until subsequent relocation
- Extension of 50mph limit to Levens Bridge: The Clerk reported that he had received confirmation that an Engineering Safety Study (ESS) was to take place this financial year and that this would then be assessed for consideration of funding in line with other ESS priorities. It was agreed that the Clerk should ask Cumbria County Council whether the lighting application by the Dallam School students has been considered
- Management of the lack of coterminosity between health and social care in order to ensure effective integrated care for parishioners: Cllr. Battye reported that there was to be a briefing about joint bodies and that she was monitoring the situation and would report back in a future meeting

172/22 Reports

- a. District Cllr. Holmes reported on the amount of phosphates going into Lake Windermere and the effect on fish and algae. Otherwise there was nothing to report
- b. County Cllr. Bingham; There was no report
- c. Shadow Authority Cllr. Battye reported that work continued on the arrangements for the transfer. The Council Plan is listed for approval at a meeting on 19 December 2022
- d. The Athenaeum: Cllr. Grindey reported that expenditure continued on improvements including to the car park lighting. The Clerk reported that quarterly accounts were to be available in future and that he had amended the Athenaeum link on the Council website

174/22 Highways / Footpaths / Trees and Woods

Highways:

a) Reports on HIAMS had been made including regarding the manhole covers in Woodhouse Lane and councillors were requested to continue to make such reports when needed

b) Reference was made to the report on HIAMS in January 2022 regarding potholes at the south end of the village. Five had been filled in but a road closure was needed for a full permanent repair. It was agreed to keep this under review

Footpaths/Tracks:

- i) The Chair reported that the third map / visitor information noticeboard was now ready to be placed by the playground when the fencing had been completed
- ii) It was reported that Adrian Tayler intended to produce electronic footpath guides as part of the reactivation of the Footpaths Group in the new year

Trees and Woods:

i) There was nothing to report other than dealt with above under the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Tree Scheme

- Cllr. Rendell had inspected the playground since the last meeting and reported no problems other than the fencing for which he had received an acceptable quote of £950 plus VAT, which may increase between now and when the work is due to be done in February / March
